PRO LIFE

What do we do about the passing of New York's abortion bill?

We grieve. We tell the truth. We walk by faith. We come alongside crisis pregnancy centers and make sure that pregnant woman know they have real options including adoption and/or substantive support from communities of believers who will become for them a family within the household of God. If we don't make the option of life substantial and real – including how they can thrive and not merely survive – then more children will be sacrificed on the altar of Choice.



THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

Faith in God is not just faith to believe in spiritual ideas. It's to have confidence in love itself. It's to have confidence in reality itself. At its core, reality is OK. God is in it. God is revealed in all things. The most powerful, most needed, and most essential teaching is always about love. Love is our foundation and our destiny. It is where we come from and where we're headed. As St. Paul said, "So faith, hope, and love remain, but the greatest of these is love" (1 Cor 13:13). God's love is planted inside each of us as the Holy Spirit, who, according to Jesus, "will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you" (Jn 14:26). Love is who you are.

All I can do is remind you of what you already know deep within your True Self and invite you to live connected to this Source. John the Evangelist wrote, "God is love, and whoever remains in love, remains in God and God in him." (1 Jn 4:16). The creation story says that we were created in the very "image and likeness" of God—who is love (Gn 1:26 and Gn 9:6). We have heard this phrase so often that we don't get the existential shock of what "created in the image and likeness of God" is saying about us. If this is true—and I believe it is—our family of origin is divine. It is saying that we were created by a loving God to be love in the world. Our core is original blessing, not original sin. Our starting point is positive, and, as it is written in the first chapter of the Bible, it is "very good" (Gn 1:31).
